WESTMORLAND AND FURNESS (ST GEORGES SQUARE, BARROW-IN-FURNESS) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES, NO WAITING AT ANY TIME & IMPOSITION OF NO ENTRY) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2025

- 1. Westmorland and Furness Council hereby give notice that on 25th March 2025 it made the above Experimental Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.
- 2. The Experimental Order will come into operation on 11th April 2025 and its effect will be to:
 - (a) Prohibit any motor vehicle proceeding along St Georges Square, from its junction with Church Street to its junction with Salthouse Road.
 - (b) Replacing 5.8m of unrestricted parking space on Church Street approach to the junction with Salthouse Road with 'No Waiting At Any Time' restriction.
 - (c) Imposition of No Entry System from Salthouse Road (A5087) into St George's Square.
- 3. The Order will continue in force for a maximum of 18 months.
- 4. Full details of the Experimental Order, together with copy of this Notice, the sealed Order, plan showing the length of roads and restrictions concerned and a Statement of Council's Reasons for making the Order may be inspected during normal opening hours at Westmorland and Furness Council, Sowerby Woods Depot, Barrow in Furness, Cumbria, LA14 4RD and at Barrow Library, Ramsden Square, Barrow-in-Furness, LA14 1LL. These documents will be on deposit from the date of this Notice for the duration that this order shall remain in force. - 5. If you wish to question the validity of the Experimental Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made there under has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within six weeks of 25th March 2025 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
- 6. Westmorland and Furness Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within six months from 11th April 2025, any person may object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation. Any such objection should be made in writing stating the grounds upon which it is made and sent to the Chief Legal Officer, Westmorland and Furness, South Lakeland House, Lowther Street, Kendal, LA9 4DQ, or by emailing TrafficTeam.Barrow@cumbria.gov.uk, and quoting reference CAVD-WSP-HGN-ZZ-DR-CH-600
