

It brings together a 'constellation' of 6 to 10 fostering families living nearby, all supported by a 'hub home' carer - someone who offers extra guidance, support, and a sense of community, much like a grandparent would. children		Members of the team at RSMP will introduce a series of powerful short films featuring foster carers across the region who've opened their homes to separated children and young people who have experienced incredibly traumatic situations – fleeing from war, persecution, violence and civil unrest. Some have been trafficked, many exploited as they made their way here and as a result need carers who understand their individual emotional, cultural and practical needs. Following the film screenings, the team talk about the urgent need for foster carers for refugee children and provide information on how the campaign is helping to create safe, supportive homes in Westmorland & Furness and across the region.

And we have recently been held up as a national case study by the social care institute for excellence.
