

Annie's Case Study

I am now thriving in life, I have been offered a really good job, I passed my driving theory test and I have completed my course."



What do your Family/Support Network think about your progress this year?

"My support network and family say I have changed massively, and they say that they couldn't be prouder of me for accomplishing so much after being in a really vulnerable position last year. They see a different side in me now and see how I now have such a positive attitude towards things."



Where are you now and what is your 5 year plan?

"I have started learning to drive, passed my theory test and have booked my first practical driving test for September and I'm saving up to buy my first car. I have been offered a full time job as a Clinical Support Worker in Royal Lancaster Infirmary's Emergency Department and currently work part time at Booths. In 5 years time I see myself learning more skills and improving massively with my job as a CSW, looking at progressing within the NHS. I see myself driving, living independently, and I also hope to be in a loving relationship."

How do you feel about your EHCP closing?

"I feel so pleased that it has closed and that it is all over. I don't need the extra support anymore which is fantastic, and my last review was the best review out of them all. I have improved in every aspect of my life."
