CCTV

- 1a. A digital colour CCTV system will be installed to cover the premises, and recorded footage will encompass all internal and external areas where the public have access to consume alcohol.
- b. The system will be maintained, fully operational, and recording at all times when the premises are open for business.
- c. The recordings will be of sufficient quality to be used as evidence in court or any other legal proceeding, ensuring they are clear enough to allow facial identification of individuals entering the premises.
- d. Copies of the recordings will be kept available for inspection by any Responsible Authority for a period of 28 days, in accordance with Data Protection regulations.
- e. Copies of the recordings will be provided to any Responsible Authority within 48 hours of request, subject to Data Protection regulations.
- f. The recordings will display the correct date and time.
- g. It is the responsibility of the management to ensure that sufficient staff members are available during operating hours to download footage from the CCTV system when requested by the police or a Responsible Authority.

Staff Training

All staff will receive documented training upon the start of their employment, covering their obligations under the Licensing Act, including:

The retail sale of alcohol
The age verification policy
Conditions attached to the Premises License
Permitted licensable activities
The Licensing objectives
The venue's opening hours

Records of this training (as described in condition 2) will be kept for a minimum of one year and made available immediately upon a reasonable request from any Responsible Authority. Additionally, documented training will be refreshed at least once every 12 months.

A Refusals Register and an Incident Report Register will be maintained. These registers will document any refusals of alcohol sales to underage or intoxicated individuals, incidents of anti-social behaviour, and ejections from the premises. They will also record any confiscation of drugs, weapons, or fake identification.

Both the Refusals and Incident Report Registers will be kept for at least one year and will be made available immediately upon a reasonable request from any Responsible Authority.

The premises will actively participate in the local Pub Watch scheme where applicable.

c) Public safety

The number of people entering and leaving the premises will be monitored to ensure that once the maximum occupancy limit is reached, no further individuals are allowed entry.

The license holder or their designated representatives will conduct a pre-opening check of the premises to ensure that there are no risks to patrons and that all necessary safety measures are in place.

The license holder will ensure that all staff receive appropriate training on emergency procedures and general safety precautions.

The license holder will ensure that all staff are fully aware of their legal obligations, social responsibilities, and their duties concerning the sale of alcohol.

Bottles, glasses, and rubbish will be regularly and frequently removed from public areas.

Fire safety measures on the premises will be maintained in good working order, and their effectiveness will be regularly assessed through fire risk assessments, as required by and in compliance with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005.

An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials will be readily available on the premises.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Clear and prominent notices will be displayed at entrances and exits, requesting patrons to keep noise to a minimum, particularly when smoking and/or leaving the premises.

Alcoholic beverages purchased on the premises may only be taken off the premises if they are in sealed containers.

Open containers of alcohol are not permitted to be removed from the premises, except for consumption in designated external areas (licensed areas) such as the pavement or highway.

No noise will emanate from the premises, nor will vibrations be transmitted through the building's structure in a manner that causes a nuisance.

e) The protection of children from harm

The licence holder will implement a Challenge 25 Age Verification Policy and will ensure that clear and visible signage is displayed at all points of sale to inform customers that the Challenge 25 scheme is in effect.

Acceptable forms of age identification will be limited to a valid passport, a photo card driving licence, identification bearing the PASS hologram, or military ID (unless and until other reliable identification technologies—such as biometric or pupil recognition—are adopted by the premises licence holder).

- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.


As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.
