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| What would support my transition? Alex finds change difficult to understand and cope with. Additional visits to his new school will help him get ready for the change. He needs to know where his belongings will go and get used to the layout of his new classroom. Visits after school will be beneficial so he can get used to the new setting while it is quiet. | Who can help me, how and by when? My new Class Teacher – book in additional visits when I can meet you and have a look around my new classroom by May half term My Key Person – will come with me on a visit so I start to understand Mum and Dad won't always be able to stay by end of June. | Progress I have made/ impact? - I need to start to get a little bit more independent with my dressing skills. I will start to try to put my own coat on. Everyone will help me and remind me to try to do this. I will start off by zipping the zipper up and work backwards from there.
- I will be having packed lunch at school as my Mum and Dad know what I like best. I will start to practice opening my lunch box on my own and unwrapping items of food.
- Share the contact details and reports from people who are there to support me and my family with my new school. That way my new school know who to contact and how.
